Brittany has been doing well throughout the pregnancy, although now in the 8th month she is very tired. Please pray for a safe and healthy delivery and for us as parents, as we adjust to life with a newborn AND toddler.


Back in January, I had the opportunity to become certified as a Wilderness First Responder, which is currently the highest rated wilderness medical training. The course was 8 days long and hosted at Hawk Mountain Education Center, where we spent many days out in the rain and snow practicing scenarios of helping those lost or injured on the mountainside. I hope with this training to be better prepared for personal emergencies while out hiking, camping,

This has been one of my favorite programs yet, as we get to show them God's awesome Creation up close and in person. Summer camp planning has been happening since the start of the new year and I will be leading Day Camp once again. The current STAND guys have been busy this winter, serving both locally and abroad.
